Community Connections provides before school and afterschool care at East

Community Connections provides before school and afterschool care at East Montpelier Elementary School. We operate a preschool at the Elementary School that supports the pre-kindergarten program at EMES. We offer camps for vacation and inservice days. We offer community events like mentoring and hunter safety with Sam Hill. We are licensed by the Vermont Department of Children and Families so we provide emergency childcare services to families that are in crisis or have a need for these services but cannot afford them. Finally, we offer a summer food program that provides free lunch and breakfast to any child in town for 9 weeks in the summer.

Approximately how many staff hours are dedicated to provide the services your organization offered East Montpelier residents during this time period? \_~3,000\_ hours

What services does your organization provide that are not available elsewhere? <u>Before school</u>, after school and preschool care on site at East Montpelier Elementary School. We are the only provider of state licensed summer camps in East Montpelier. We are also the only provider that offers camps during school vacation and inservice days in town. We are the only summer food program provider in the U-32 and Montpelier school districts.

If applicable, how does your organization collaborate with organizations providing similar services? <u>We work collectively among all the Community Connections sites, with WCSU, Montpelier Public Schools, Central Vermont New Directions, Wrightsville Recreation District, Montpelier Recreation Department, Just Basics, Washington County Sheriff's Department, Family Center of Washington County, Montpelier Alive, Washington Central Friends of Education, and the Montpelier Senior Activity Center.</u>

In what way are the services your organization provides preventative in nature?

<u>Community Connections provides programs that support positive youth development, social skills development, and character development for at risk youth ages PK-12<sup>th</sup> grade. We also have programs that prevent child hunger and help at risk youth attend school based preschool programs. Afterschool is the most common time of the day for youth to engage in risky behaviors and our programs keep them out of trouble during these crucial times of day.</u>
