I'm very excited about my work with the Town as its newest Clerk and I'm eager to get started. While it's my wish that this be a smooth transition, the shareholders of Brio have made a request that requires Selectboard approval before I can give them a definitive response.

Since I am the only employee (other than the co-founders) to work at Brio for the entire time the company was actively marketing its product, I've set up their systems, product database, state and federal tax and compliance information, certification, customer set ups, and a host of other projects. It takes time to wind the business down, and I am the one person who has both the ability and the credentials to perform these tasks productively and efficiently. The shareholders request that I work for Brio no more than 4 hours per week, beginning on the week of September 11 and ending on or before September 30. They understand I have made a commitment to working at and learning a new job and recognize that anything I did for them would need to occur during evening hours. These hours work best for them because of the six-hour time difference between Vermont and Hawaii.
