Welcome to Clarice Cutler, who was just appointed by the SB.

Continued Discussion on Revisions to Draft Zoning Districts and Next Steps

The PC reviewed the topics discussed by the Steering Committee.

Issue 9)Towne Hill Road and Cherry Tree Hill in RL2

- > Suggest having informal conversations with residents
- Generally it makes sense because Towne Hill is a major connector road; no support along Cherry Tree Hill
- Area between Towne Hill and Cherry Tree Hill: should we leave as 3-acre minimums because it is fully developed
- > Should we keep as RL2 or same as surrounding area: the PC agreed to make it the same as surrounding area

Issue 10) RL2 along County Road

- Want more density along paved roads
- > Very little land that can be developed; same as Towne Hill Road
- Little support on the PC for keeping as RL2
- > Should we keep as RL2 or same as surrounding area: the PC agreed to make it the same as the surrounding area

Issue 11) RL2 along Center and Barnes Roads

- > Option is RL2 or whatever the light green turns out to be (RL3 or RL5)
- > Consider separating the two areas; review the hamlet definition and area
- ➤ Consider RL2 on Cutler Heights
- ➤ Should we keep as RL2 or same as surrounding area: PC was evenly split on the issue

Issue 12) RL10

- Originally set out as conserved land, forest blocks and high quality ag land
- ➤ PC reviewed Map 11, Significant Forest Blocks
- Look at the boundaries first; conserved land doesn't necessarily need to be in RL10
- > Discussion on what is wrong with Zone E as it is currently
- Ms. Watson suggested keeping Zone E as RL5
- The Chair noted that the data set that Ms. Saxton worked with is not entirely accurate
- Discussion regarding Zone E versus RL10; remove small islands of RL10
- ➤ Ms. Cutler suggested making RL10 RL7 instead
- Straw poll on preferences: RL10 0; RL7 5; less than RL7 3

Act 250 Applications

The PC has standing in two hearings: Cote-Wong and Cross VT Trails. The Cote-Wong comments are due soon but it is an amendment of an existing permit. The DRB had approved a subdivision in the river corridor. The PC agrees to not weigh in. There is no action needed for the Cross VT Trail hearing.

Updates

- North Montpelier Village Center Designation the application will be considered on 9/23; Richard Amore is recommending approval
- > Hazard Mitigation Plan the CVRPC staff has reviewed the comments and drafted text to address the comments
- ➤ Energy Committee no update
- ➤ Rural Roads Vegetation Assessments PAC Ms. Vissering reported that the group is now coming up with a plan to look at the ash trees that were inventoried along the roads.
- Old LaPerle Farm Property Committee still working with Marc Fontaine, who would like to buy 30 acres or more for tiny homes

6 new permits since last meeting. The Recreation Board is coming to the DRB for a shed amendment; 7 red maple trees will be planted on 10/31.
