Continued Discussion on Revisions to Draft Zoning Districts

The PC revisited some of the remaining zoning discussion topics.

- ➤ County/Center/Cutler Heights
 - o Dover Road in Montpelier; how close does it come to Cutler Heights
 - o Montpelier zoning is 2-acre minimum, East Montpelier is currently 3 acres
 - Consider making this area 2-acre minimum
 - o PC would like a map of the Montpelier piece to have a better view of the area
 - o Re-visit at the next meeting
- \triangleright Route 214 RL2 in the top corner
 - Discussion about protecting the forest block
 - It isn't a high priority connectivity forest block/interior
 - Some of the conserved land has 2-acre carve-outs for development
- > Center Road (Issue 7)
 - o RES2 is off the table
 - O Do we want a separate district or use the zone surrounding it?
 - O Discussion of 1-acre minimum to 2-acre minimum
 - o People who live on Center Road do not want more density, but PC feels that they would accept a 2-acre minimum
 - RL2 would provide more flexibility
 - Look at uses in RL2 and RL3 may be similar with the differences just being minimum acreage
 - \circ Sense of the PC RL2 4; RL3 5
 - o Strong inclination to measure front setback from road centerline instead of edge of ROW
 - o If RL2, do we like the proposed boundary?
 - Yes, happy with the boundary as configured, not as random as other districts
- RES2 areas outside village, North Montpelier, Gallison Hill
 - o Re-visit extending MU4 up Quaker Road
 - o RES2 around EMES (Village Res = 1 acre)
 - RES2 is proposed ½-acre minimum
 - Additional density near the school makes sense
 - \circ Sense of PC $-\frac{1}{2}$ 3; 1 6

Updates

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- ➤ Hazard Mitigation Plan FEMA has formally approved our plan; it is good for the next 5 years
- ➤ Energy Committee Ms. Biggs has asked if members are interested in staying on the committee; check with SB to resurrect the committee; there is no urgency/deadline to get the plan done, but it must be part of the Town Plan
- Rural Roads Vegetation Assessments PAC
 - Committee is writing a grant application for \$15k for a pilot project at U-32, including removing 17 trees and public education
 - o Discussion on what will happen with the wood
 - \circ 3,000-4,000 ash trees in the town ROW
 - o Preemptively removing trees in the town ROW before they become dangerous
 - o 1/13/20 forum at U-32 Room 128 at 6pm to get feedback on pilot program and the program going forward
 - Committee is coordinating with neighboring towns
 - o Part of the program is replanting new trees
 - New name Resilient Roadways Committee broader mission to include invasive species; not including erosion and road maintenance
- ➤ Old LaPerle Farm Property Committee moving forward with Fontaine purchase, SB accepted the offer; boundary adjustment needs to be done, town keeping the piece next to the Park N Ride
- Conservation Commission establishment to be decided by voters at Town Meeting
