Vermont Arborists is an Accredited company by the Tree Care Industry Association. Accreditation is the highest standard for any tree service in the US, with 505 in the nation and only 4 in Vermont. Accredited companies must have certified arborists and certified tree care safety professionals on staff.

We have 3 certified arborists, 3 certified tree care safety professionals, and 3 CDL drivers. Most staff have taken advanced first aid. We also have taken the Electrical Hazard Awareness Program (EHAP) training making several staff certified line clearance technicians.

Our bucket truck has been dielectric tested. We noticed that several trees are adjacent to power lines and telecommunication lines. OSHA regulations require all utility lines be treated as energized and that employees be trained in working around wires which includes EHAP training. The boom on a bucket truck must have its dialectic testing done. A tow behind boom from a rental agency is not OSHA approved for this work.

We also have two pesticide applicators certified by the state of Vermont allowing us to inject insecticide into the ash trees.
