**LOTTERY SCHEDULE**

Within ten (10) days of the end of request period, requests will be randomly selected up to the allowed number (15) of hunting permits. Selections will be made by the Town Clerk or his/her designee and will be done at a time and place accessible to the public.

Drawing will be held Wednesday, October 7, 2020, 11 a.m. at the town office building. Date will be published in local newspaper with NOTICE OF HUNTING/TRAPPING PERMITS being available.

If by the request deadline, fewer requests are received (15) than permits available, the Town Clerk may forego the lottery selection and issue the permits to those requesting them, holding any allowed, un-issued, remaining permits for issuance on a first-come, first-serve basis.

**PERMIT TERMS**

The Town will develop a list of selected hunters and will issue permits and a map of the property to those selected. Permit will clearly identify the name of the holder, and that he or she will have hunting rights on the Mallory Brook property during **one (1) year** from date of issuance of the permit, which shall be the date of the drawing. A copy of the list of selected hunters will be sent to the landowner and kept on file at the Town Office.

Persons awarded hunting permits will be able to hunt during any season on the Protected Mallory Brook property. However, trapping and the use of tree stands (temporary and portable) will be allowed only with landowner permission.

**POSTING**

Landowner may continue to post the Protected Property with "NO HUNTING" signs, prohibiting hunting by the general public, provided that the signs note that permits are available from the Town for a limited number of hunters per year, and that any signs that discourage un-permitted hunting do not discourage general public access. The landowner may also post during harvest periods or in cases of special circumstances to protect public safety and natural resources.
