Re: Request for town appropriation

Dear East Montpelier Select Board,

Rural Community Transportation, Inc. (RCT) respectfully requests that the following special appropriation article appear on the 2021 warning for Town Meeting:

Article: Shall the **Town of East Montpelier** vote to raise, appropriate and expend the sum of \$7,833.06 for the support of **Rural Community Transportation**, **Inc.** to provide services to residents of the **Town of East Montpelier**.

RCT operates bus service to residents of East Montpelier on our VT Route 14/15 Commuter and US 2 Commuter buses with connections to Barre, Montpelier, Burlington (on GMT's Link), Morrisville, as well as to towns along these routes (including Hardwick). All RCT bus routes are fare-free so the agency must rely on other methods of generating necessary local match funds for our grants.

In the past, the appropriations for the US 2 Commuter have been solely requested by GMT (a total of \$8,333.00). As of July 2020, RCT is operating the majority of the US 2 Commuter routes, and is requesting our portion of the level funded request (\$6,833.06) directly. Last year, RCT requested \$1,000 to service the Route 14/15 Commuter, which brings the total level funded request to \$7,833.06.

RCT is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) corporation which provides public transportation services throughout Caledonia, Orleans, Essex and Lamoille Counties. RCT operates with federal and state funding; however, our funding sources typically require 20% - 50% local match dollars. All town appropriations received are used to provide the required local match.

We hope you will be able to assist with this request and look forward to our continued service to the residents of East Montpelier.

Bus Service

In FY20, RCT buses traveled a total of 95,714 miles across our service areas of Caledonia, Essex, Orleans and (newly added!) Lamoille Counties, with service points in Washington County. Our bus service connects passengers to destinations throughout and beyond Vermont.

The RCT Shuttle/Commuter/Shopper Bus system keeps people connected to work and family and community.

RCT is committed to efficient travel and reducing Fossil Fuel consumption. In FY20, RCT received funding to put two new electric buses on the road.

Dial-A-Ride

In FY20, NEK residents called our Dial-A-Ride Program for a total of 134,053 trips to healthcare appointments, jobs, school and more. Though the emergence of COVID-19 reduced demand, we were honored to provide essential rides with safety as our priority.

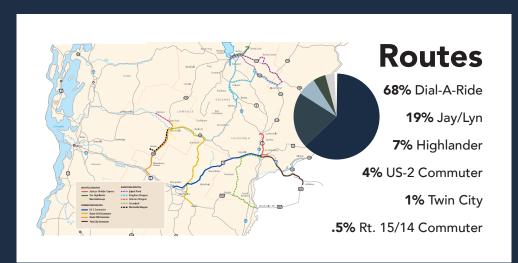
