## **Discuss Next Steps on Public Engagement Exercise**

Mr. Sullivan presented the results from the brainstorming exercise from the last meeting (attached). The commission initially talked about putting the themes out for voting, and we did talk about that a little while we were doing the categorization work, and a few people thought that for what we're doing here we don't necessarily want to cut this down to a small number of things right now. We also discussed how we want to use this data for a future forum or survey at this point it's data for us to use, and we may decide that we want to include a lot of the themes/items in the survey, but may also want to ultimately do a prioritization exercise to focus on some of the areas in more depth (i.e. in some sort of in-person public engagement event/forum where we need to focus down to a smaller number of things). The forum or engagement will help us prioritize citizen's interests in the town.

Ms. Zimmerman and Ms. Petito thought that after much discussion, that we need to think about how to use the data for editing the Town Plan's Goals and Actions, and that we may want to have the Housing component as its own meeting. We want to leave open all options to gather data and allow people to express their concerns.

Mr. Hall suggested that we lead with the survey to gather data and concerns. Mr. Sullivan took a straw poll, and everyone agreed that we should begin with a survey to gather interests for actions relating to the Town Plan and Zoning. This will allow citizens to get their voices heard. The survey can also be used as an educational tool for prioritizing themes and topics. Ms. Zimmerman volunteered to look at themes and topics/items to generate a draft survey for review by the commission. Ms. Petito and Ms. Watson agreed to meet with Ms. Zimmerman and help with the draft survey.

## **Discuss Next Steps on Housing Study**

We briefly discussed a possible housing task force and thought that this should be tabled until we have a better understanding of the housing needs in all of Washington County. The data derived from a survey will help educate the PC on additional housing needs.
